A Whitley Award is designed to provide the winner with:

- Financial support to pursue their ongoing conservation work

At each Whitley Award Ceremony there are up to nine Whitley Awards of £30,000 each, plus the Whitley Gold Award which is worth £60,000 over two years. All of the Whitley Award winners are automatically considered for the Gold Award.

RTPI YOUNG PLANNER OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI) award is in the gift of the Institute and is intended to seek out and acclaim the brightest younger planners involved in the town planning profession. This could be in planning practice, innovation, enterprise or philosophy.

The winner will receive a place at the American Planning Association's National Planning Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana from 10-14 April 2010. This will include flights, accommodation and £200 spending money.

In addition, the winner will also receive a place at the Planning Summer School, where he/she will be asked to give a talk on their experiences in New Orleans. They will also have the opportunity to speak at the annual RTPI Young Planners' conference, usually held in October.

Entrants must be under the age of 35 on 31 December 2009. Nominations will be accepted from employers, colleagues, friends or relations or any member of the Institute who believes a young planner's particular contribution should be celebrated.
