

# Unemployment Bulletin

Issue 8 March 2009

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#### INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Economic section of the County Council Chief Executive's Support Unit Research Team. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.


#### **PART 1: SUMMARY**

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 3.5% in March 2009. This was an increase of 0.3% on the February 2009 figure. The rate has been continually increasing since July 2008. The UK rate has increased by 0.1% between February and March 2009 with the South West rate increasing by 0.2. Gloucestershire's rate remains above the South West average of 3.1%, but 0.5% lower than the UK average of 4.0%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in March 2009 rose by 979 people. The amount of people claiming in March 2009 was 8.7% higher than the number in February 2009 compared to a 4.9% increase in the South West and 4.4% for the UK.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire has been increasing since July 2008, it was 137% higher in March 2009 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

# YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

A the end of March 2009 there were 723 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire. This figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.4% which shows an increase of 0.4% from last month. Analysis of numbers of NEET joiners in recent months reflects a 25-30% increase compared to the same period in 2008.

# PART 2: UK, SW AND GLOUCESTERSHIRE INDICATORS

The unemployment situation in Gloucestershire compared to the South West and the UK.

#### **Claimant Rate**

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 3.5% in March 2009. The rate has remained slightly higher than the South West average over the past year, but persistently lower by approximately 0.5% against the UK average during the same period. March 2009 represented a 0.3% increase on February 2009.

Table 1 shows that in March 2009, the numbers of claimants in Gloucestershire was 8.7% higher than the numbers in February 2009. This is 4.3% higher than the UK figure and 3.8% higher than the South West.

The average growth in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to March 2009 was 10.7%. This is 2.9% higher than the UK average and equal to the South West region.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - March 2009




Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for March 2009 in Gloucestershire. Every district in Gloucestershire experienced an increase in the claimant rate between February 2009 and March 2009.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts




Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count for Gloucestershire over the past year. It demonstrates the gap that is widening across all the districts as the UK economy continues in recession. The widest gaps unsurprisingly reflect the urban areas of Cheltenham and Gloucester.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham was at its highest for over a year at 3.9%. The rate has been climbing for eleven consecutive months.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 5 shows the claimant count continually increasing each month since July 2008. In addition, claimant counts have increased every month compared to the same month in the previous year since July 2008.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - March 2009



Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 7 shows the claimant rate in Cotswold District was at its highest for over a year at 2.1%. The rate has been increasing since June 2008.

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - March 2009




Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District. Eight wards lie above the District average of 2.1%.

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean was at its highest for over a year at 3.8%. The rate has been increasing since July 2008.

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - March 2009



Figure 13: Gloucester City claimant rate over the last year




Figure 13 shows the claimant rate for Gloucester City was at the highest point for over a year at 4.6%. The rate has been increasing since May 2008.

Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - March 2009




Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City. Seven wards are above the City average of 4.6%.

Figure 16: Stroud District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 16 shows the claimant rate for Stroud District was at 2.9%, the highest it has been for over two years.

Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - March 2009




Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 19 shows the claimant rate for Tewkesbury District was at 2.9%, the highest it has been for over a year.

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 20 shows that claimant count has on the whole been increasing since June 2008. The rate in March 2009 figure was 136% higher than it was in March 2008.

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - March 2009










# PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

#### **SUMMARY**

As at the end of March 2009 there were 723 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire. This figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.4% and this shows an increase from the 4.0% achieved at the end of February 2009. We are also reporting increases in the numbers of NEET young people in all Districts with the most significant increase during March being in Cheltenham. Analysis of the numbers of NEET joiners in recent months is also evidencing a 25-30% increase based against the same period in 2008.

#### Review of Gloucestershire's NEET strategy

The Gloucestershire NEET partnership forum met during March to review our response to the recession thus far and to ensure that we continue to coordinate our efforts over the coming months. The key actions agreed are detailed below:

- Job seekers workshops aimed at school leavers or young people who are currently in the NEET group, these will be rolled out over the next few months to offer enhanced support and practical tips around job seeking
- Positive Activities for young people the Youth Support Service are currently developing a series of activity days/residentials aimed at young people in the NEET group. The aim of these sessions is to combine the best of outdoor activities with personal development sessions to help some long term NEETs re-engage with positive activities
- Developing additional opportunities for young people we are continuing to work closely with LSC colleagues to increase the range and spread of opportunities for young people in the NEET group. This years Budget announcement in April may provide some additional funding to support this.

We also agreed to that we need to undertake a review of the County NEET action plan to ensure that it is still 'fit for purpose' in the current economic climate. Following on from the review, the revised version of the action plan will be published on the GCC website.
