

# Pilgrove Way Play Area

## Proposed Landscape Improvement



### 1 Wildflower Area

A native wildflower meadow mix is sown. Chosen especially to attract bees, butterflies and other pollinating wildlife, to help improve habitats for insects around the site.



### Play Equipment

#### 2 Pod Swing

The Pod Swing can accommodate many users of all ages making it the ideal location to catch up with friends. It is also very inclusive for less able bodied users.

#### 3 Rodeo Board

The Rodeo Board seeks to replicate the exhilarating sensations you would receive from wind surfing. Suitable for 2 users, it allows friends to meet, challenge and try to master the technique.



#### 4 Bat Boxes

Bat boxes are positioned in quieter areas of the play area to help support and encourage the local bat population.



#### 5 Bird Boxes

Bird boxes help to provide suitable nesting sites to encourage a variety of native birds and wildlife.



#### 6 Tree Planting

Ornamental pear trees line the edge of the community orchard. Abundant blossom is produced in March, folwed by by glossy foliage which is late to fall in autumn, when it turns orange and red.

#### 7 Community Fruit Trees

A small area of local varety apple trees, planted by the local community and local school children, will be established on the grass area. The trees will be attractive in blossom, produce fruit, and will be a valuable learning experience for local families and schools.



#### 8 Wooden Seating

Simple and robust wooden benches will be placed near to the children's play area.



#### 9 Picnic Benches

New picnic benches are provided for families in and around the children's play area.
