







As part of the No Child Left Behind year of action, in February 2019 we will be looking at relationships and how having healthy, positive relationships can help young people to thrive.

No Child Left Behind and Gloucestershire Domestic Abuse Support Service (GDASS) would therefore like to invite you to attend:

FREE Domestic Abuse and DASH Training sessions for teachers and support staff with the aim to support teachers in supporting young people and parents who are experiencing domestic abuse.

This is a 3 part, twilight course for teaching and school staff in primary, secondary or higher education. The workshops are for education staff who are interested in becoming more aware of what domestic abuse is, the impact it has on young people and what they, as an organisation, can do to help support the young people and the parents they are working with. The workshop will cover what professionals working with young people can do and how to respond effectively and safely. The course will also give an overview of the Domestic Abuse Stalking and Harassment (DASH) risk assessment which is completed with both young people and adults to assess their risk due to domestic abuse.

The course will be run by Sarah Pinkney from Gloucestershire Domestic Abuse Support Service.
