



Stage 2 **Implement** March 2020 - May 2020

- Undertake the planting
- Launch the improvements • Put in a plan for maintenance

Stage 3 Maintain From May 2020 onwards

WHO'S IN THE PROJECT TEAM?

The project is sponsored by Tracey Crews, Director of Planning, CBC and co-ordinated by CBC's Townscape Team. The project team includes Cheltenham West End Partnership, Friends of Winston Churchill

Memorial Garden and Green Space Volunteers

TIMESCALE Work needs to be complete by the end of spring 2020.

£18,000 - financed equally by the Cheltenham Borough Council and the European Union

CONSTRAINTS

**BUDGET** 

CBC resource is limited by the need to continue other aspects of the Habitat Cheltenham

programme in parallel.. This will constrain the scope of the work in the Memorial Garden.

**EXPECTED BENEFITS** 

As well as the outcomes identified above we need to demonstrate to the EU that we have increased the amount of rehabilitated land and the area of habitats supported. We'll be measuring the difference we make!
