
This advice note is for all staff undertaking duties during the 2020 Cheltenham Festival outside of normal office duties.

Whilst the overall risk of infection remains low at present, the significant increase of people coming to Cheltenham for the Festival will increase the risk of infection and contamination. This advice note to staff is based on the best available advice currently issued.

Steps staff must take to minimise the risk of infection:



Thank you for your email. I understand the concerns you raise although as you will be aware when it comes to whether or not the racing goes ahead in the current circumstances is not a decision for the council but for central government.

For me the key thing is that any decision should be based on best medical advice. I'm not privy to that advice but it appears this is what government is following based on statements by the Chief Medical Officer. Clearly things are complicated as overreacting (eg recent panic buying) can create as many problems as underreacting. As a community stakeholder, we care very much about the wellbeing of all parties relating to the staging of our events. As such, I wanted to write to you to share some insight into the latest situation with The Festival being staged Tuesday 10th March to Friday 13th March, and the public health measures we are taking.

British Racing has been in close communication with the UK Government on the current public health situation.

As with events from England v Wales attended by the Prime Minister at Twickenham on Saturday to 10 Premier League games around the country this weekend, the Government guidance is for the business of the country to continue as usual, while ensuring we adhere to and promote the latest public health advice.

On that score, we have put the following in place:

- · Pre-event communication advising all customers to follow official Government public health advice
- Directing visitors to the homepage of our website to this health advice: https://www.thejockeyclub.co.uk/cheltenham/injunction-and-terms-and-conditions/public-health-updates/
- · Installing additional toilets and hand washing facilities across Cheltenham Racecourse, in addition to our normal provisions
- · Additional staff operating in all toilet areas to ensure that soap and drying facilities are constantly available
- Antibacterial hand gel will be made available and we have published where dedicated hand sanitiser locations are on our website: https://www.thejockeyclub.co.uk/globalassets/images/cheltenham/about/injunction/hand-sanitzer-wall---locations.pdf. You may have seen hand sanitiser stations shown on the news that were in use at Twickenham, which we are using for The Festival
- · Posters around the racecourse as a reminder of public health advice

While we are taking these precautions, I thought you might also be interested in the comments of the Chief Medical Officer responsible for Scotland, speaking ahead of the Six Nations match with France. Dr Catherine Calderwood said: "I've looked at the scientific evidence very carefully, and what's emerging is that there's actually very little impact on virus spread from mass gatherings, particularly if they are in the open air. This is not a risk to the Scottish population in hosting this match."

As one of the major sporting events in this country, The Festival is of huge importance to the sporting community but also provides significant benefit locally, delivering upwards of £100m in economic benefit to the local community; we are taking all steps to ensure that this event takes place as safely as possible for racegoers, participants and local residents.

Please do let me know if you have any questions and I hope to see you at Cheltenham Racecourse very soon.

Thank you for your email. I understand your concerns regarding the risks posed by the spread of Covid-19. However, the decision on whether the Cheltenham Races takes place is not one that falls within the remit of Cheltenham Borough Council. Any decision to postpone or cancel the races will be made by the Racecourse under instruction from Central Government. At present, no such instruction has been given and therefore, at the time of writing this, the races will be going ahead as planned.

From a Cheltenham Borough Council perspective, I do want to assure you that the Council is taking this situation very seriously. We have mobilised our own business continuity group which is linked to wider agencies both in Gloucestershire and nationally to prepare and consider what actions are needed to mitigate the impact of Covid-19 should the spread of the virus continue to increase in the coming weeks and months. However, as I say above, I am afraid our powers do not extend to cancelling events such as the Cheltenham Races and any other large scale events that are organised outside of the Council.



It is also not possible to make comparisons between hospital trusts across the region as they all serve populations of differing size and characteristics. Fortunately the South West region has seen the lowest number of cases and deaths in the UK and we continue to work hard to support communities during these unprecedented times."

Notes to editors

The decision to go ahead with the festival was taken by the racecourse, based on national guidance at the time. In view of the decision to proceed, we provided advice to the racecourse in relation to additional hygiene measures that they could put in place for racegoers and staff.
