

## Statement concerning Adult Social Care funding

The Secretary of State made an offer to adult social care authorities. (“Adult social care authorities” are local authorities which have functions under Part 1 of the Care Act 2014, namely county councils in England, district councils for an area in England for which there is no county council, London borough councils, the Common Council of the City of London and the Council of the Isles of Scilly).

The offer was the option of an adult social care authority being able to charge an additional “precept” on its council tax without holding a referendum, to assist the authority in meeting expenditure on adult social care from the financial year 2016-17. Subject to the annual approval of the House of Commons, the Secretary of State has extended this offer in each financial year up to and including 2022/23.

Gloucestershire County Council has set an adult social care precept of 1.00%, and a general precept increase of 1.99%, resulting in an overall 2.99% increase.

The calculation is as follows:
